
















What is the vision and where is it?

ENTRANCE EXAM

English

- The English test is a 45 minute extended writing task.
- Students will be asked to write their response to a stimulus, such as a question or statement.
- We are looking for well-structured, imaginative and accurate writing.
- Marks will be given for the quality of written communication which includes spelling, punctuation and grammar.



Mathematics

- The Mathematics entrance assessment will only test topics taken from the English Key Stage 2 Assessment Framework.
- The questions are designed to assess student's confidence with a range of mathematical operations, as well as simple problem solving and mathematical reasoning skills.
- This year's paper will consist of around 30 questions to be completed in 45 minutes.



Mathematics

- Topics that will be tested come mainly from the following domains:
 - Number and ratio: arithmetic, decimals, percentages, fractions, factors and multiples.
 - Shape and space: Properties of simple shapes and angles.
 - Data handling: Understanding and using data, which may be, presented in a statistical diagram.
- Students will not need any mathematical equipment, other than a writing implement.



CAT4

 The Cognitive Abilities Test (CAT4) is a diagnostic assessment that is designed to help students and their teachers understand how they learn and what their academic potential might be. It assesses how students think in areas that are known to make a difference to learning.



CAT4

While many tests focus on a child's attainment in core subjects,
 CAT4 is designed to give schools a much broader, more rounded
 view of each child, their potential and how they learn. Results help
 teachers decide about the pace of learning that is right for a student
 and whether additional support or challenge is needed.



CAT4

 Tasks involve thinking about shapes and patterns (Non-Verbal Reasoning), words (Verbal Reasoning), numbers (Quantitative Reasoning) and some questions are answered by mentally generating and transforming visual images (Spatial Ability).



Dubai College is an inclusive school and we welcome applications from young people with SEND; we do not charge any additional fees for students with additional needs. We have students on roll with dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyspraxia, ASD, physical disabilities, hearing, visual and sensory impairments and BESD. In the summer 2021 GCSE examination series all of our candidates with additional needs gained passes at level 5 or above in every examination.
